Property

We are working to change the policy settings around RTLB accommodation and to provide a Third Party Occupancy Contract document for you to use with your Host Schools. We will update you as soon as decisions are made.

National RTLB Database

We are also close to outlining the options for the National RTLB Database. Shortly we will be calling for expressions of interest from CMs and Practice Leaders to be involved in a working group to confirm the specifications of the database, so that we can be sure that what is built meets your needs.

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Updated information for the rollout of *Collaboration for Success: IEPs*

RTLB and their local SE office should be continuing to work together to both develop and put in place their local plans for the rollout to schools. There has been some discussion about the IEP 'template' which has been developed as part of the rollout kit.

A secondary school national working group has been convened to consider the IEP process in secondary schools and to look at both key messages and examples of the use of IEPs in secondary schools.

Field Supervision into the PG Dip Specialist Teaching Programme

Alison Kearney, Massey University, raised the question of your already-trained practitioners in the field being available to provide guidance and feedback to the second year RTLB students as they plan, execute and reflect upon their practicum. She has also written to you all outlining the model of field supervision and what it would entail.

It is in your best interest to have professional, evidenced based practitioners with knowledge and access to the latest thinking and research. Through this supervision, already-trained RTLB would gain, along with the second year trainee. Clusters are currently developing supervision processes, so this opportunity to supervise a colleague/student should fit within this wider supervision process. Massey University is looking at the need to consider what support they would offer if there is a failing student.

TELA Laptop leases

A reminder that TELA laptop lease contracts can be terminated but, as with any contract, there is likely to be an early cancellation fee.

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Gateway Assessments Update

A reminder that there has been a recent change to the Gateway guidelines for RTLB document that makes it clearer that the RTLB service is intended for children **at the point of entry** to care, rather than for children already in care.

There is no reason why RTLB cannot access the CYF material (available on the CYF site) - it's just that the material on the TKI site has been developed with RTLB specifically in mind, so the content and focus is slightly different. The three Gateway agencies (CYF, Education and Health) have each developed material to reflect their role.

Cloud Computing Guidance
