
Term four has been very busy as Ministry regional office staff have worked with their RTLB clusters to continue to implement the Learning Support Delivery Model.

Tomorrow's Schools Review

Chris Hipkins recently announced the key decisions from the Government's reform of the Tomorrow's Schools System. These include:

- more frontline support for schools through a new education agency, as part of a redesigned Ministry of Education
- more support for principals and school boards including a new centre of leadership and local leadership advisor roles
- new independent disputes panels for parents and students
- management of school property simplified and/or transferred to the Ministry to free up boards' time
- enrolment zones to be managed locally, not by each school.

Recruiting staff overseas

As RTLB are registered teachers employed by schools, the lead school can apply for the School Finders' fee to help with recruitment costs. The candidate may be eligible for the Overseas Relocation Grant.

For schools to be eligible for the finder's fee, they must:

- be a state or state-integrated school
- employ a teacher who:
 - has not been residing in New Zealand for the last 12 months
 - is New Zealand or overseas trained
- employ the teacher in a full-time teaching position for at least 12 months
- provide evidence of incurred costs of overseas recruitment excluding travel costs
- apply for the reimbursement within six months of the teacher's start date
