Hui-a-tau

It's the one time of the year when Ngā Pouwhirinakitanga o Aotearoa can come together as Māori to share effective practice and knowledge, discuss issues pertaining to RTLB and more importantly our mokopuna Māori; a forum rich in cultural supervision, networking and professional learning development relevant for those RTLB who work in and across Māori Medium.

He Pikorua Update

We have started to upload the content of He Pikorua on the external website. We will develop an introductory video which will take people through the website. This, alongside a range of information sheets will be available to support MOE and RTLB implementation. MOE and RTLB teams have been engaging with the He Pikorua in Action and principles outlined in the draft documents and we have heard of excellent examples of collaboration on this work. We are continuing to work towards website activation.

What's new in the library?

How the best bosses interrupt bias on their teams: strategies to foster equity and inclusion by Joan Williams & Sky Mihaylo (2019). Harvard Business Review, 97 (6), p. 151-155. Looks at how managers and leaders of work teams can ensure that diverse voices are included and heard. Talks about how bias plays out in everyday work interactions and describes how to recognise it. Presents tips on selecting diverse employees, managing day-to-day work, and developing teams and career pathways over time.

Te Whāriki: an early childhood curriculum in a superdiverse New Zealand by Angel Chan (2019). New Zealand Journal of Educational Studies, 54 (2), p. 245-259.

Investigates how Te Whariki 2017, the updated New Zealand early childhood curriculum, responds to increasing ethnic and cultural diversity, or superdiversity.
