### Te Rourou Whai Hua

The Ministry has created an online resource space called Te Rourou Whai Hua (Te Rourou). It sits alongside the Learning Support Network (LSN) run by Massey University.

Te Rourou is designed to support the work of Learning Support Coordinators (LSC) and other in-school learning support roles. While it is on the same learning management system as the LSN, it is open access to all practitioners.

It is a collection and curation of resources, links, tools and websites already available to educators in Aotearoa. The purpose of this space has been to organise the resources in a way that is meaningful and useful to LSCs.

Te Rourou is designed around the collaborative inquiry elements of He Pikorua in Action. By using He Pikorua in Action there is a shared approach and common language in the work LSC do with others in learning support, including RTLB.

Te Rourou is iterative. Resources can be added and removed as necessary. It is open to feedback from those using it so, where appropriate, we can respond to ideas, suggestions and requests.
